



Faculty: Arthur W. Harvey, DMA is currently Visiting Professor, Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, University of Louisville School of Medicine during the 1988-1989 academic year. Dr. Harvey is Professor of Music at Eastern Kentucky University, Executive Director of the Music For Health Services Foundation, Organist for First Baptist Church, Winchester, Kentucky and active as a consultant and teacher in programs throughout the world. His *Music and The Brain* T.V. series and his many publications and seminars on Music and the Brain, Music and Health, and Music with Handicapped Persons have earned him an international reputation. He has served as coordinator for two national conferences on Music and Health and will coordinate the Third National Conference on Music and Health at Eastern Kentucky University in November 1989. In addition to teaching in many states throughout the United States, he has taught in Canada, China, Morocco, Venezuela, Hong Kong, England and Puerto Rico and will be lecturing in Denmark, Germany, New Zealand and Australia this year as well as teaching courses on the brain during the summer at the University of Hawaii and Potsdam College, State University of New York. While at the University of Louisville School of Medicine this year, his involvement in the Program for Arts and Medicine includes developing and directing several research projects, teaching courses in music and medicine, directing a Medical School Students Chorus and Instrumental Ensemble, serving as consultant and guest speaker for several institutions and leading training seminars at the Genesis Center.
